Apprenticeships, traineeships, VET, University (requiring an ATAR) or work



Apprenticeships, traineeships, VET, university (through alternative entry programs) or work (No ATAR)



VCE student

VCE Programs Approach: More Information

- Completing English or EAL or Literacy is compulsory in all VCE Learning Programs
- Subjects must be selected from a Learning Program that best suits your individual future pathway and career goal
- All programs allow room for a free choice. When completing a VM Pathway, the external VET subject and your SWL are your free choices
- If selecting Specialist Maths, you must also undertake Maths Methods
- There is a financial cost for each subject with an asterisk (*)
- All VCE students will complete 6 subjects in year 11 VCE and 5 subjects in year 12.
 You will complete a year 12 application process in term three 2024 where you indicate which subject you would prefer to drop in year 12. Every attempt will be made to ensure that students will be able to drop the subject of their choice however, this cannot be guaranteed in every single circumstance.
- VCE VM students will complete 5 subjects in year 11 and 5 subjects in year 12
- SWL (structured workplace learning) is an essential part of all VM Programs. This means that you will spend a day a week in a workplace of your choice. This will give you the chance to apply what you are learning at school and in VET and create great connections that might lead to future employment
- Internal VET refers to the VET offered by the school to Lakeview students only
- Cluster (External) VET refers to the VET offered by the Brimbank and Western Edge cluster. This VET is held on a Tuesday for year 11 students and a Thursday for year 12 students.
- To be successful in your VCE VM certificate, you must complete a Unit 1-4 (Year 1 & 2) VET

Note: If you choose to apply for the following subjects, you <u>MUST</u> complete an additional application form BEFORE course counselling day.

See your coordinator to collect the following EXTRA forms:

- EAL
- Sport and Recreation
- 3 folio subjects (Any 3 of Visual Communication, Art, Studio Art, Media, Product design, Systems engineering, Computing)
- A VCE Unit 3 and 4 subject (without completing unit 1 and 2)

VET (Vocational Education and Training)

All students who choose a <u>VM pathway will need a VET</u> and it's important to have some backups ready in case they are necessary. You should only complete a VET as a VCE student if you are passionate about this future career pathway and have seen Jo Maxwell.

If you are choosing a VM pathway or wish to apply for a VET as part of your VCE pathway, please click on the VET link on the year 10 Teams page.

When exploring VET elective studies, you should consider courses that:

- Interest you and you are good at
- Lead to a job that interests you or prepares you for further training
- You can easily travel to as most of these courses are offered at external schools
- Contribute to your ATAR (if you are choosing a VCE pathway and want to complete VET as one of your subjects)

ATAR Calculation Guide Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)

Who gets an ATAR?

VCE students (Not VCE VM students)

How are ATARs calculated?

- All scores are scaled by VTAC (Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre)
- Students receive individual study scores for their subjects
- The ATAR is a rank, not a mark. The ATAR is a **number between 0.00 and 99.95 with increments of 0.05** that indicates a student's achievement relative to other students. For example, an ATAR of 80.00 means that you are in the top 20 per cent of your age cohort

ATAR: English score + highest subject score + 2nd highest subject score + 3rd highest subject score + 10% of fifth highest subject score (if applicable) + 10% of sixth highest subject score (if applicable)

Have a look at the tables below of how an ATAR is calculated. These will give you a better understanding of how your performance in each subject affects your ATAR.
