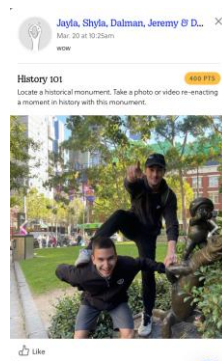
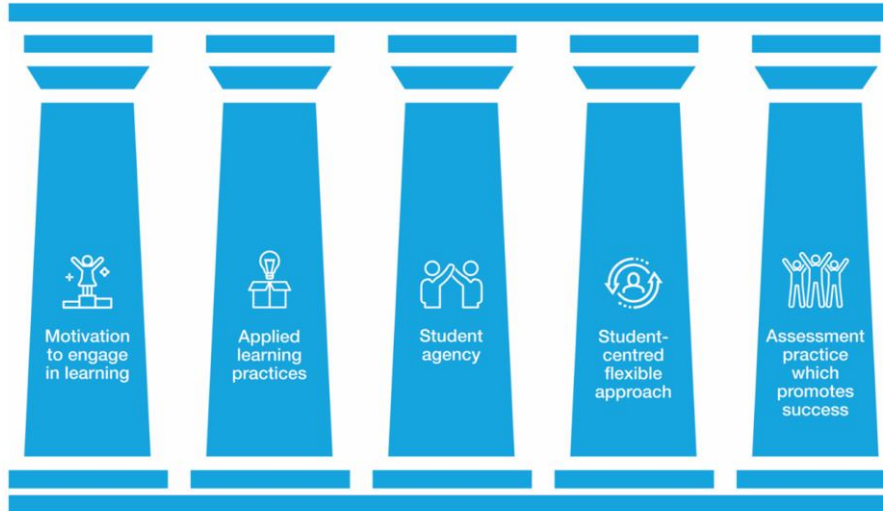

Assessment within the VCE VM

All assessments are school-based and assessed through a range of learning activities and tasks.

Unlike other VCE studies there are no exams at Year 12.

VCE VM studies do not receive a study score.



Satisfactory Completion

To be awarded the VCE VM qualification, students must successfully complete a learning program that contains a minimum of 16 credits and includes:

- Literacy
- Numeracy
- Work Related Skills
- Personal Development Skills
- Structured Workplace Learning
- VET



Students in VCE VM must successfully complete a VET in order to obtain a certificate.

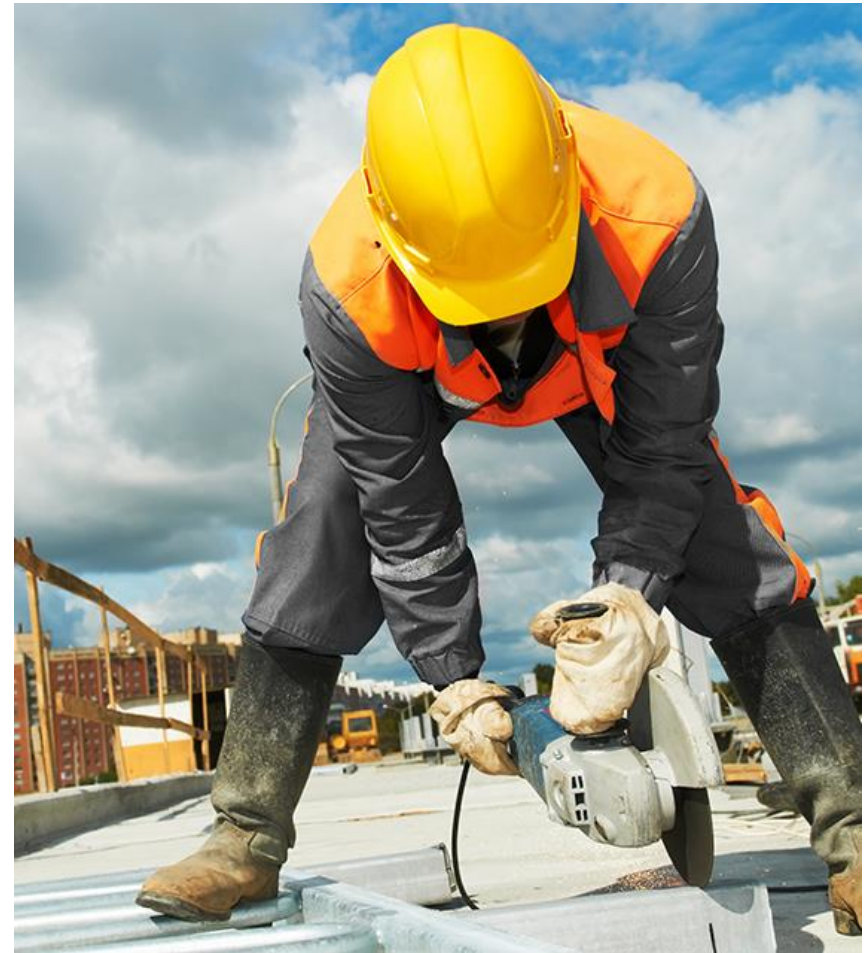
Structured Workplace Learning

Students are required to undertake work with an employer relevant to their VET elective.

Students will be regularly monitored and may be assessed on the job.

SWL must be organised in advance to secure a placement – All students must complete this.

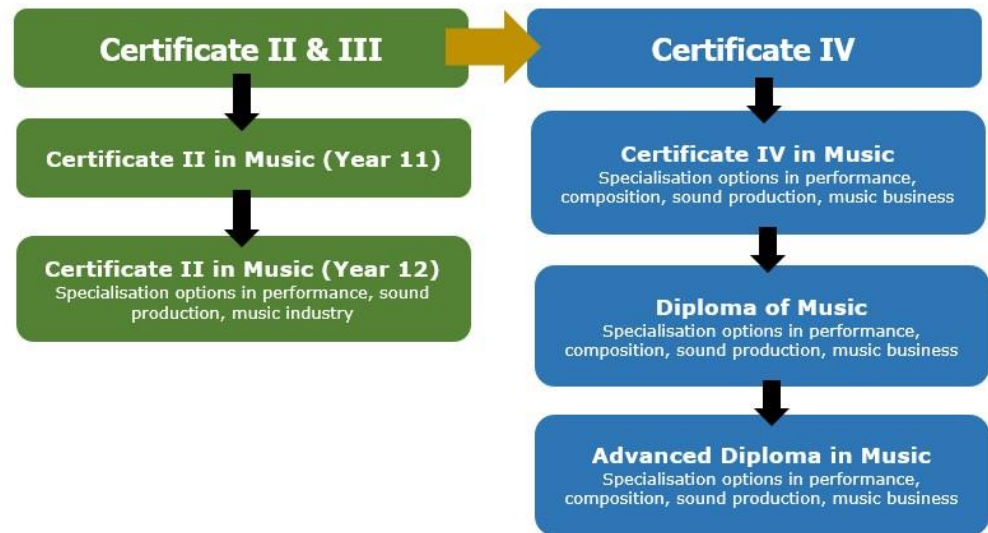
Unlike work experience, SWL is an actual class and has assessments.





What is VET?

- VET is a two year program.
- It enables students to complete a nationally recognised vocational qualifications at the same time.
- Important Industry Specific Skills and workplace skills are learnt through the VET program.





VET REQUIREMENTS

- Students are permitted two absences (8 hours) a Semester or four (16 hours) for the year. An additional two approved absences will be allowed for school camps, excursions or illness with medical certificate.
- Students may be required to attend make up classes after school or during school holidays.
- Some VET Classes run into the school holidays

STUDENTS WHO FAIL TO COMPLETE SET TASKS, BY THE END OF THE TERM THAT THE TASKS WERE SET, WILL BE WITHDRAWN FROM THE PROGRAM

Travel to and from VET



- Students at Lakeview Senior College find their own way to and from their VET course.
- Part of the commitment to the VCE VM program is satisfactorily completing a chosen VET certificate.
- VET is scheduled every Tuesday unless otherwise informed.
- Please inform Jo maxwell if your child is absent from their VET.



Head Start Program

- Head Start is a school-based apprenticeship and traineeship (SBAT) program.
- Head Start students receive paid on-the-job training that contributes to their VCE Vocational Major.
