# Promotion Policy and Requirements

The aim of year 10 is to prepare you for the demands of VCE and VCE VM. Together we will continue to develop your ability to focus in class, meet deadlines, submit work, implement effective study skills and satisfactorily complete units

1. Students complete 6 units each Semester. They must pass 9 out of 12 units across the year (4 in Semester Two)
2. Must pass English/EAL in Semester 2
3. Must pass one unit of Connections
4. Must demonstrate **positive work habits and behaviour** that shows that you are VCE Ready
5. Must provide a medical certificate when missing an assessment task

*Individual circumstances (illness and overseas travel) will be taken into account if a student follows the appropriate school policies and procedures*



Every subject that you choose to study in Year 10 will have an exam



These exams will be held at the end of each semester



You will learn a range of study skills and be provided with time to develop your revision notes in your classes and in Connections



They will prepare you for Year 11 & 12 and be used to evaluate whether students are VCE or VCE VM Ready

All Year 9 students will be making their subject choices online



We will be providing support with this in **Term 3** through presentations at your current school, parent information sessions, posting information on our school website and emailing all families

# Year 10 Subject Selection

Students have the opportunity to undertake a Year 11 subject in Year 10.

The process for applying for a VCE subject is as follows:

1. Complete Application Form as part of the Subject Selection Process (Term Three 2026)
2. Collect and provide teacher recommendations
3. Undertake a Literacy Test at Lakeview
4. Interview

# AFL & Football Development Program

- 2027 (Year 10): AFL & Soccer Development Programs
  - These two Year 10 programs provide students with a year of preparatory activities to best support them in being successful in the Year 11 and 12 Sport and Recreation course.
- 2028/2029 (Year 11 & 12): VET Sport and Recreation
  - Sport and Recreation Certificate 3 with either an AFL or Soccer focus
- Costs & Inclusions: approx. \$265 and \$450 (TBC)
  - uniform, before and after school gym access, strength and conditioning coach, termly sport psychology session with guest presenters, ongoing sports nutrition advice and 1 workshop per term with dietician, active pool recovery sessions
- Application Process
  - Written application **DUE ON THURSDAY 28<sup>th</sup> MAY WITH ENROLMENT ENQUIRY**
  - Fitness/skills testing – Term 3
