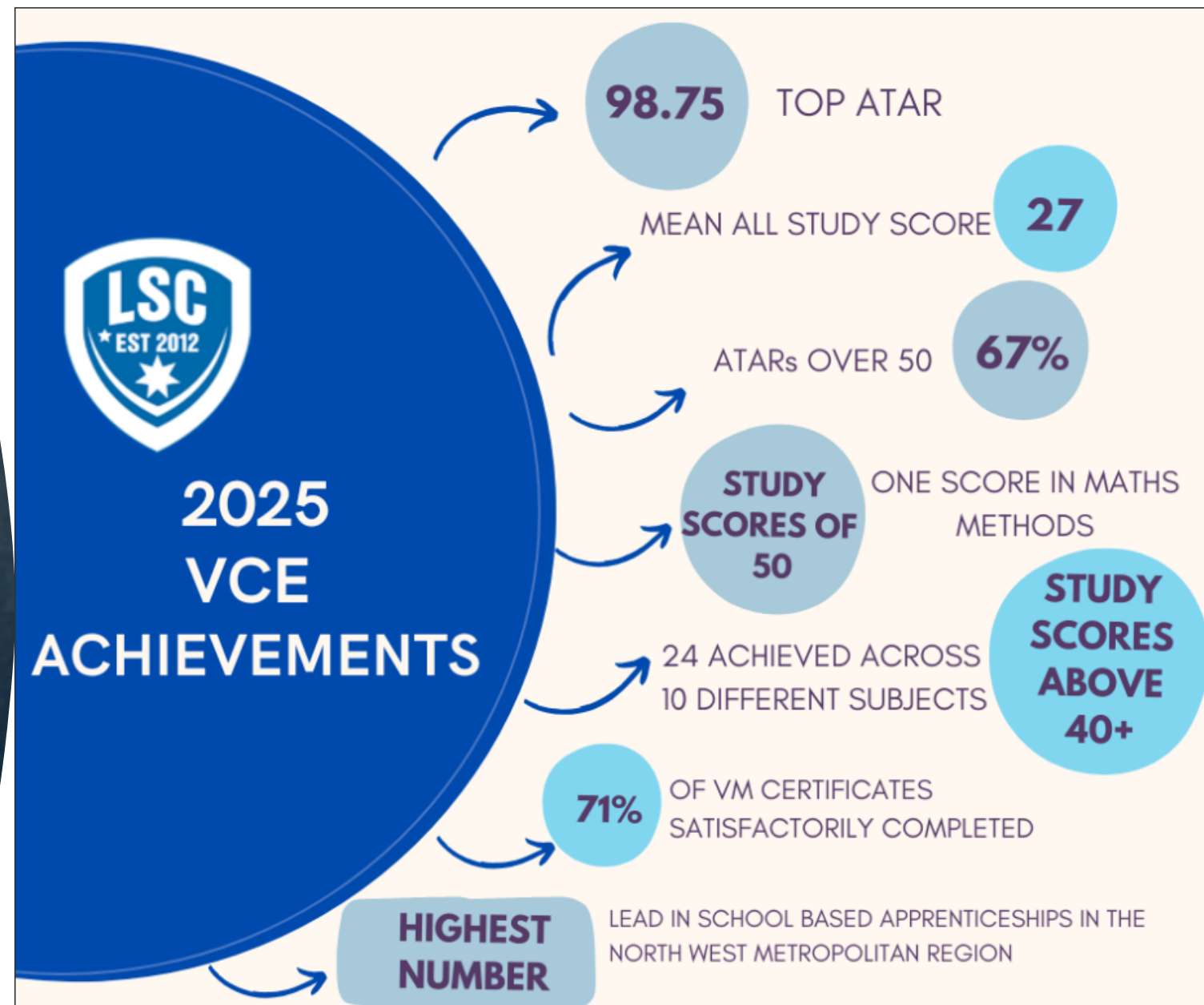

The focus of Lakeview is to support students developing the skills necessary to be successful for their future pathways. In Year 10, we prepare students to undertake an appropriate program in Years 11 and 12.

VCE - Victorian Certificate of Education

- Classroom focus where you:
- build deep knowledge of a subject area
- apply theoretical skills and knowledge through experiments, practical activities

VCE Vocational Major (VM)

- is a new program within the VCE – it replaces our current VCAL program
- has an applied learning focus
- concentrate on your future through real world learning contexts
- Learning happens in a classroom, the workplace, and community

Promotion Policy

Year 10 students are required to successfully complete:

- **9 out of 12 units over the year**
- **at least 4 out of 5 units in Semester 2, which must include English**
- **Elite Soccer and AFL students who do not pass both units of Foundation Maths or their Accelerated subject will not be able to access the Elite Sport and Recreation Program in year 11 and 12**

In order to access a scored VCE Program, students must also achieve at least 40% in four or more of their Semester Two exams.

Students who select a subject/s in which they scored below 40% in the exam will be required to complete and commit to an Academic Support Plan.

At Lakeview, we also support students who choose not to complete VCE in developing the skills needed to be ready to successfully complete an apprenticeship, traineeship or transition into full time work

Maths Methods – Only pick this if you are achieving above Year 9 level. NAPLAN scores, PAT test data and assessment tasks will be considered before acceptance into this subject

Accelerated subjects/Elite AFL and Soccer: These will not be preferences. Your free choice 3 and 4 will be pushed to your first 2 reserve subjects. We will manually change this when selected

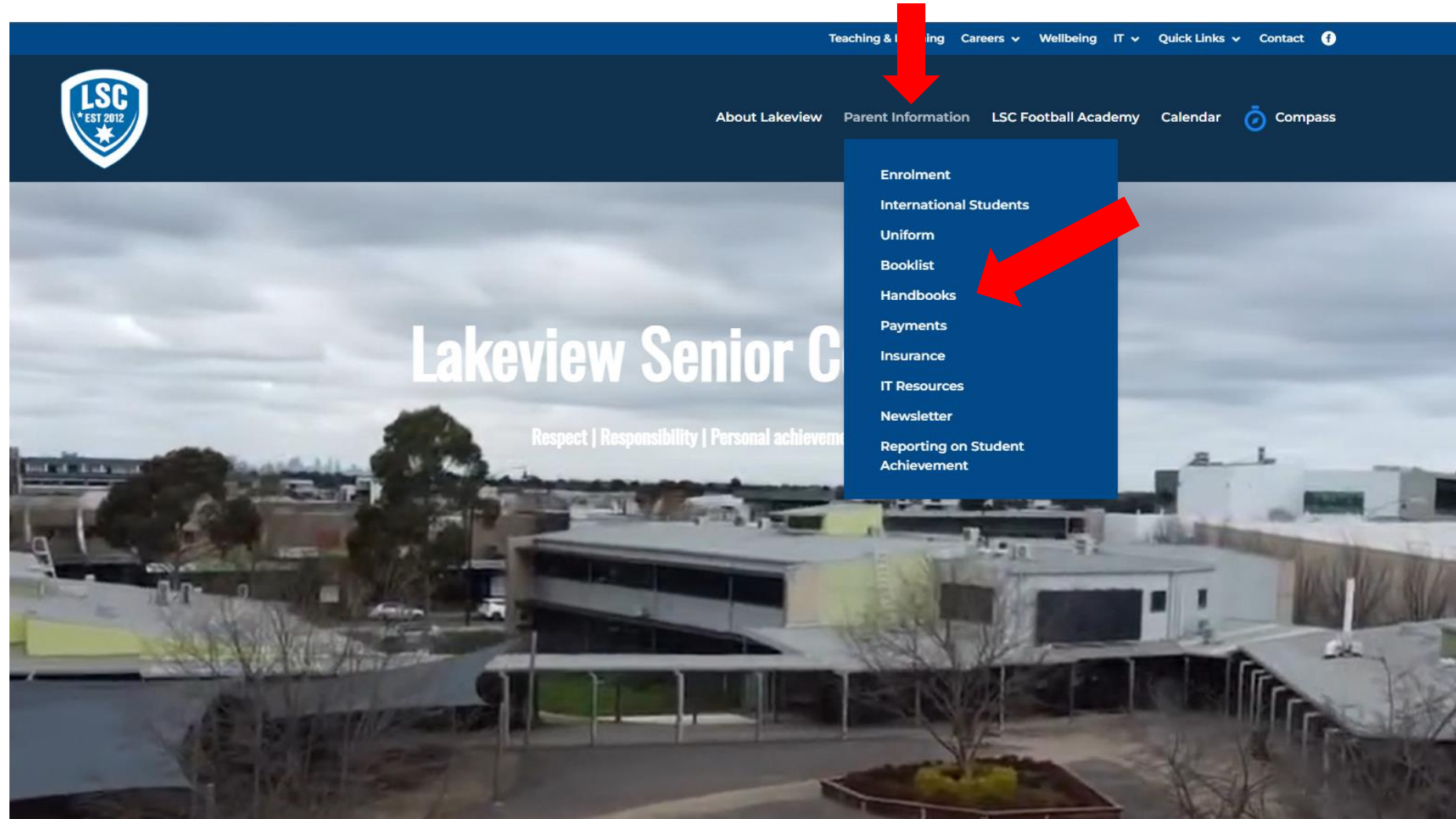
